

**CHOOSE THE RIGHT ARTICLE**

In the centre of 1) \_\_\_\_\_ Sydney you can find 2) \_\_\_\_\_ Hyde Park which was named after 3) \_\_\_\_\_ London's Hyde Park. The southern section of the park contains the ANZAC Memorial building and numerous monuments and statues. The northern section features the iconic Archibald Fountain which was constructed to commemorate the association of 4) \_\_\_\_\_ France and 5) \_\_\_\_\_ Australia in World War I. Facing 6) \_\_\_\_\_ Hyde Park is 7) \_\_\_\_\_ St Mary's Cathedral. The architecture is typical of the Gothic Revival of 8) \_\_\_\_\_ 19th century. You can see the Australian Museum on the corner of 9) \_\_\_\_\_ Hyde Park and 10) \_\_\_\_\_ College Street. Originally called the Colonial Museum, it was renamed the Australian museum in 11) \_\_\_\_\_ mid-1830s. During 12) \_\_\_\_\_ 1850s, 13) \_\_\_\_\_ Hyde Park became a venue for Sunday political, civil and later, election meetings. It was also used for processions and official gatherings such as the ball to welcome 14) \_\_\_\_\_ Queen Victoria's son, 15) \_\_\_\_\_ Prince Alfred, 16) \_\_\_\_\_ Duke of Edinburgh, in 17) \_\_\_\_\_ 1868. Sandringham Garden is a memorial to 18) \_\_\_\_\_ kings George V and George VI and was opened by 19) \_\_\_\_\_ Queen during her first visit to 20) \_\_\_\_\_ Australia in 21) \_\_\_\_\_ 1954.
