| low-income           | to increase in size, number, amount or importance  |

| resounding           | to use a device to discover the proportions/size/amount of smth  |
| freshman             | to find your way at sea by using a map   |
| navigate             | to make sb feel interested or enthusiastic about sth   |
| founder              | the place you go through to get access to a certain area   |
| thrive               | a person who established an institution or organisation  |
| stimulate            | a student in the first year at a high school or university (in the usa)  |
| gateway              | to take up space in an area  |
| occupy               | to grow and develop well; to flourish  |
| state school         | a school that receives no money from the government and where the education of students is paid for by their parents |
| private school       | a school for young children, usually aged 5 to 11  |
| primary school       | a school run by the government that provides free education  |
| secondary school     | a school where children can live and study during the academic year  |
| public school        | a school which provides training and teaches skills for particular professions                                       |
| nursery school       | a school for students between 11 to 16 or 18   |
| sixth form college   | a school where either girls or boys are taught   |
| vocational school    | in Britain a private school for students aged 13-18 whose parents pay for education                                  |
| grammar school       | a school for children between 3 and 5 years old  |
| boarding school      | a secondary school for boys and girls of all abilities over 11   |
| comprehensive school | a school in Great Britain for students 11-18 who have high academic ability  |
| single-sex school    | in Britain a school providing education for students aged 16-18  |
