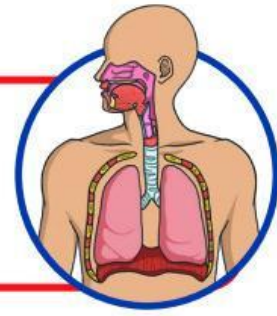


# Respiratory System Vocabulary Match

- A muscle below your lungs that helps you breathe in and out by moving up and down.
- The inside of your nose where air is cleaned, warmed, and moistened before going into your body.
- The back part of your throat that connects your nose and mouth to your windpipe and esophagus.
- A tube that carries air from your windpipe into your right lung.
- The larger lung on the right side of your chest that helps you breathe.
- The holes in your nose that let air in and out when you breathe.
- The lung on the left side of your chest that helps you breathe.
- Also called the windpipe, it carries air from your throat to your lungs.
- A tube that carries air from your windpipe into your left lung.
- The opening where air and food enter your body.
- Also called the voice box, it helps you speak and protects your airway when you swallow.
