Gastropods (snails and slugs)

Evolution

- minerals in the bodies of gastropods are like those in the 31.....
- fossils date back 500 million years

Physical features

- single, muscular foot
- radula (used for feeding)
- Shell (snails only)
- size: British shells range from 1.5-50 mm
- form: most shells coil to the 32.....
- some shells have ribs, spines or 33.....
- they have various colours and patterns

Feeding habits

- mainly feed on rotting plants, fungi or algae

Predators
