

## Past simple

1. A finished action in the past that happened in an exact time (yesterday, last week, in 1968, etc)

(+) I **went** to school yesterday.

(-) I **didn't go** to school yesterday.

(?) **Did** you **go** to school yesterday?

## Present perfect simple

1. An experience in someone's lifetime, without saying the exact time when the event happened

(+) I **have visited** Vienna twice.

2. Recent events which have a result in the present

(-) My son **hasn't cleaned** his room yet. (= I can see his messy room)

3. Actions or situations that began in the past but continue in the present

(?) How long **have** you **known** Sarah?  
I've **known** her for 20 years.
