Step-by-step Support

Step 1. Choose a topic

4 Conclusion – summary + action

Choose ONE ending: - To sum up, this problem can be solved if... - In conclusion, it is essential to take action because... - If these measures are taken, the situation will improve.

Helpful Linking Words (use at least 3)

- **Cause & effect:** because, due to, as a result, therefore
- **Addition:** moreover, furthermore, in addition
- **Contrast:** however, although, despite
- **Sequencing:** firstly, secondly, finally

Useful Vocabulary (B2)
