## MODALS OF ABILITY AND POSSIBILITY

- **Present:** Use **can** for ability in the present or **am/is/are able to**
- **Past:** Use **could** for ability in the past or **was/were able to**
- **Future:** Use **will be able to** or **won't be able to**.
- **Possibility:** **Can** is for general statements, while **could** is used for specific events that are possible but not certain.
