HEADLINE

This is the most important part to **grab** attention. It needs to be **catchy**.
(llamativo)

INTRODUCTION

You need to **hook** the reader immediately. Tell them what you are writing about and why they should care.

For example: "Have you ever felt completely overwhelmed by the amount of homework you have?"

CONTENT

This is where you explain your ideas. Usually, you will have 2 or 3 paragraphs here. To make your writing "flow" (fluir), you need **Linking Words** (conectores) and **contrast your ideas** (*although, however, while, despite, in spite of*)

For example: Firstly, it is essential to create a study schedule. Secondly, you should turn off your notifications while studying.

CONCLUSION

Don't just stop writing! You need an "outro." Summarize your main point and give the reader something to think about.

For example: In conclusion, managing your time is difficult, but it is worth it. Try these tips today!
