

UNIT 0: GRAMMAR

Objective: To understand the negative and interrogative form of present simple by asking and answering 3 questions.

CONTENTS

NEGATIVE FORM OF PRESENT SIMPLE

STRUCTURE: subject + don't/doesn't + infinitive verb + complement

Examples:

1. I don't **go** to the supermarket every day.



2. She doesn't **study** at night.



REMEMBER:

- Infinitive verb: no conjugation
- When the subject is I, you, they, we, use don't (do not).
- When the subject is he, she, it, use doesn't (does not).

INTERROGATIVE FORM OF PRESENT SIMPLE

STRUCTURE: Do/Does + infinitive verb + complement

Examples:

1. Do you listen to music?
Yes, I do.
2. Do you watch fiction series?
No, I don't.
3. Does your dog bark at night?
Yes, it does.



REMEMBER:

- When the subject is I, you, they, we, **use do**.
- When the subject is he, she, it, **use does**.
