The first Mardi Gras was held in 1703 at 27 Mile Bluff and was moved with Mobile in 1711 to where Mobile stands today. The first parade wasn't until 1830, which was when Michael Kraft and a group of his friends broke into a hardware store and grabbed rakes, cow belles, and hoes to parade around the streets. They called themselves the Cowbellion de Rankin society. In 1857, Mobile shared Mardi Gras with New Orleans and New Orleans had their first parade. During the Civil War, they did not celebrate Mardi Gras as a sign of respect to the soldiers fighting in the Civil War, but in 1866 Joe Cain revived Mardi Gras by parading down the street as an Indian. Today Mardi Gras is a celebration of the beginning of the 40 days of Lent.
