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Nouns: Nouns are people, places, or things. They help us show who or what we are talking about.

People: boy, woman, (1)

Adjectives: Adjectives describe nouns. They help make our sentences more interesting and help to give more information.

Verbs: Verbs are action words. They tell us what someone or something is doing. You can also have stative verbs. They describe a state like love, see, or want.
