Balloons and sky lanterns: In countries such as China, India, and Japan, releasing balloons or sky lanterns provides a spectacular sight. Trees play an important role in protecting the environment, especially during natural disasters. For centuries, people have recognised that trees help **prevent** soil erosion and reduce the risk of flooding while serving as natural barriers against storms and landslides.

Trees can **absorb** large amounts of water, which is why they are often planted near rivers and along coastlines. Because of this capability, during heavy rains, trees help keep the soil from taking too much water and reduce erosion.
