The Rooftop Concert

It was a cold day on January 30th, 1969. Paul McCartney, John Lennon, George Harrison and Ringo Starr were in the Apple Music studios on Saville Row Street in London. It wasn't a good time for the Beatles. They didn't want to work together anymore. They hated being in the same room together, so they decided to do something different.
