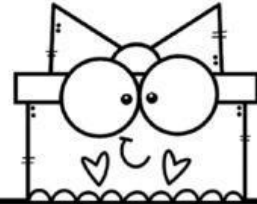






































# Bright Fragments and Run-ons!
