excerpt from "I Have a Dream..." speech
delivered by Rev. Martin Luther King at the "March
on Washington"

I have a dream that my four little children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character. I have a dream...I have a dream that one day in Alabama, [...]one day right there in Alabama little black boys and black girls will be able to join hands with little white boys and white girls as sisters and brothers.

Passage 2
Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is a federal holiday held on the third Monday in January each year. Dr. King was born on January 15, 1929, in Atlanta, Georgia. By the time he was 25 years old, he had completed his Ph.D. and earned his degree in 1955. Throughout his life, he played a major role in the Civil Rights Movement. In 1955, he led a citywide bus boycott. Later, on August 28, 1963, he gave his famous "I Have a Dream" speech at the historic March on Washington. He is the most widely known African-American leader of his time.
