

Future with be going to and will

BE GOING TO for decided plans: We use be going to when a plan or decision is made before speaking.

Form: subject + am / is / are + going to + base verb

Examples

- I'm going to relax at the beach next weekend.
- We're going to go surfing every day.
- She's not going to do anything special.

Use it when:

- The plan is already decided.
- You often mention time expressions like **tomorrow, next week, this summer.**



WILL for possible plans or decisions made now: We use will when the decision is not decided yet or is made at the moment of speaking.

Form: subject + will / won't + base verb

Examples

- I'm not sure. I guess I'll stay home.
- Maybe I'll take a course this year.
- I think I'll go camping.
- I probably won't go anywhere.

Use it when:

- You are not sure.
- You use expressions like maybe, I think, I guess, probably.
