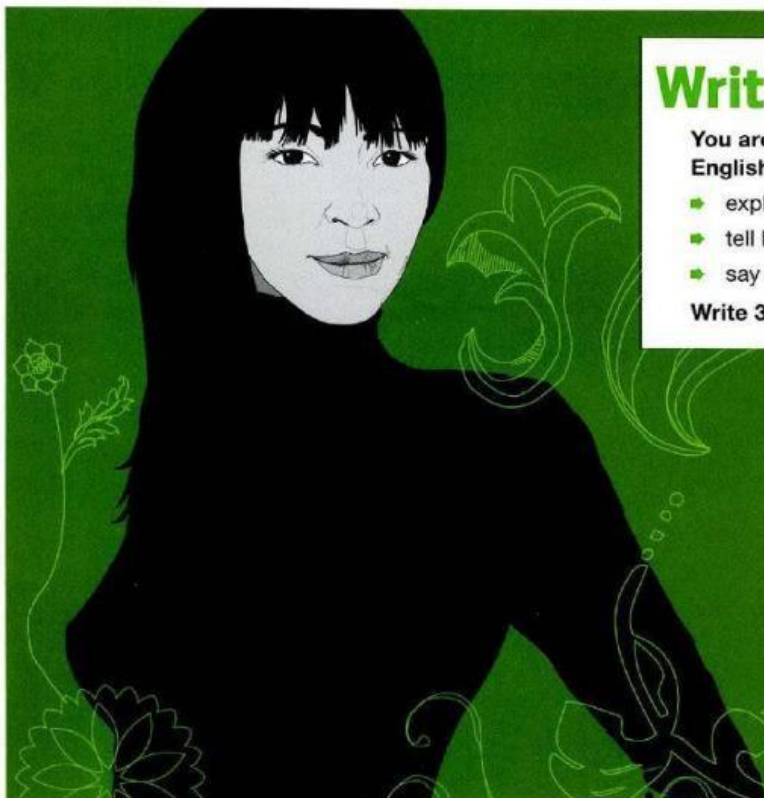
I just wanted to tell you about my holiday arrangements and to see what you're doing tonight!
