UN scientific advisors have recommended the Great Barrier Reef not be placed on a list of world heritage sites "in danger" but emphasised that the planet's biggest coral reef system remains under "serious threat" from global heating and water pollution.

Unesco said in a report that the Australian government had taken positive steps to protect the reef since a UN monitoring mission visited Queensland in March last year. The UN mission report listed several steps the federal and state governments should make to protect it, including improving water quality, introducing sustainable fishing strategies and removing gillnets from the park. That report also

said the government should have “clear **commitments**” to cut greenhouse gas emissions “consistent with the efforts required to limit the global average temperature increase to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels.” Since the UN mission in March, the report said the Albanese government had set an improved target to cut greenhouse gas emissions by 43% by 2030 and to reach net zero emissions by 2050. Experts have said Australia’s latest 2030 target is not consistent with a global goal of keeping global heating to 1.5°C.

The federal environment minister, Tanya Plibersek, said: “Unesco’s draft decision acknowledges that, under Labor, Australia is once again serious about protecting the Reef and acting on climate change. “Our Great Barrier Reef is one of the planet’s most outstanding natural wonders. I encourage people from around the world to come and see our beautiful reef for themselves - you’re very welcome.”

The Complex of Hue Monuments is wholly owned by the Government of the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam. Guided by the 1972 Convention on the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage, the National Heritage Law (2001, revised in 2009), and a number of other provincial regulations and decisions, the Hue Monuments Conservation Centre is responsible for the management of the complex and the protection of its outstanding universal value.

The Complex of Hue Monuments is given special attention in the Socio-Economic Development Master Plan of Thua Thien Hue Province, which provides direction for the **conservation** and restoration of the complex through 2020. In addition, an Adjusted Planning Framework for the Complex of Hue Monuments (2010-2020) was approved by the Prime Minister on 7 June 2010. This should control any further infrastructure projects that could impact the property. The details of how this will protect the site should be explained in the Management Plan and it should be included in the regulatory framework for Hue (the Master Plan).

It is important that the works needed to **minimise** the negative impact of noise and visual pollution on the Minh Mang and Khai Dinh tombs and to reduce the impact of the new highway are completed. Any remaining illegal buildings within the site should be removed. In addition to development, climate change and natural disasters are other potential problems for the long-term management of the property. To reduce the impact of floods, three dams are being built upstream along the Perfume River. In addition, the traditional water network and drainage system within and around the Citadel will be restored, as a means to reduce the damage to the World Heritage property and protect its inhabitants from the risk of flood, and to restore the historic network of ponds and canals.

The level of tourism at the Hue Monuments is increasing to a point where it needs to be managed so as to be suitable with the capacity of the site. This issue should also be addressed in the Management Plan.
