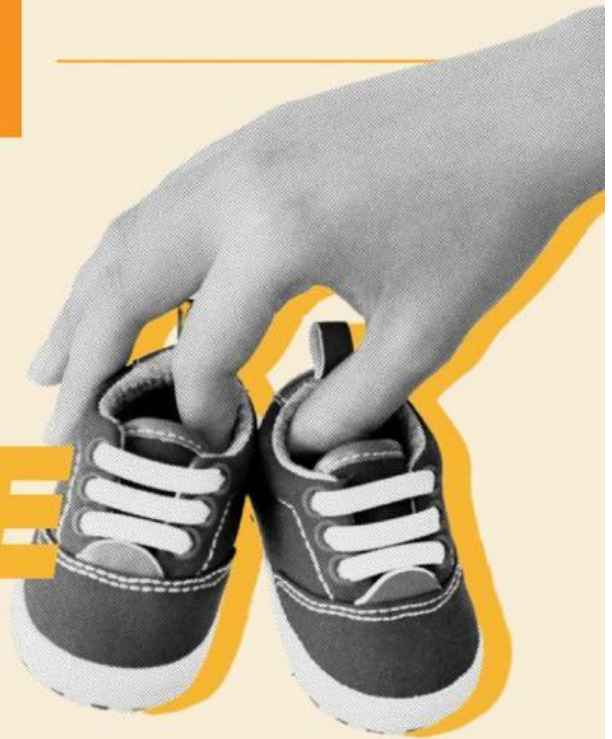


A BABY ROUTINE

Grammar Point - Present Simple Review (Third Person Singular)

1. Read the sentences. Underline the verbs.

She burps the baby.

She washes his baby bottles.

The baby cries because he's hungry.

2. When we use the third person singular (He, She, It), the verbs in the present need to change. Study the rules:

- For most verbs, add s - She breastfeeds the baby.
- For verbs ending in 's', 'sh', 'ch', 'o', 'x', 'z', add es - The baby does tummy time.
- For verbs ending in a consonant + y, remove y and add ies - The baby cries a lot.

In *negative sentences*, we use 'does + not (doesn't)'. The verb keeps its infinitive form (no more changes to the verb):

She doesn't bathe the baby in the morning.

We invert 'does' and the subject pronoun (He, She, It) to *form questions*:

Does he take a nap in the morning?
