## Comparatives

The screens are *bigger*. It's *more exciting than* 3-D.

## (not) as ... as

The experience *isn't as good as* 3-D.

## Superlatives

It's *the latest* 4-D experience.

It's *the best* feeling in the world.

## less/the least

The musical is *less popular than* the film.

The love scene is *the least exciting* in the film.

## too/(not) enough

I was *too uncomfortable*. My car wasn't *fast enough*.
