HIDDEN MESSAGES IN ADVERTISEMENTS

When you watch an advert on the telly, or when you hear one on your radio, you may be seeing or hearing more than you think. Advertisers have found ways to add hidden messages that are 'subliminal', or below the level where a person can notice them. For example, a jingle on the radio might include a song or a few words that are played over the jingle so softly you can hear them only in your subconscious mind, and you don't know they are there. A television advert might include images that are played for a few milliseconds each time, so you don't know you're watching them. In addition, magazine adverts may have pictures hidden within pictures; for example, pleasing scenes that can barely be seen are sometimes drawn into the ice cubes in a cold drink shown on a page.

Many advertisers believe that subliminal messages make people want to buy their products even if they don't know what's happening. It might not even matter if shoppers remember the advert when they see a product on a shelf in a shop; the subconscious mind remembers the hidden message, and these messages can make the shopper buy without knowing why.

Experiments about subliminal thoughts have been done since the 1800s. In the mid-1950s, an American advertiser said that he had greatly increased the popcorn and cola sales at his cinema by flashing messages like 'Eat Popcorn' and 'Drink Cola' across the screen so quickly that viewers could not understand them.

The subject got a lot of interest, and tests were done to see whether subliminal advertising really worked. It has since been shown that there is no possibility that people will run out and buy products just because of subliminal adverts. However, if they are shown two adverts and are then asked to choose between two brands of the same type of product, they will likely choose the one that was subliminally advertised.

Subliminal advertising is illegal in the United States, Britain and Australia, because a person is given no choice, but is forced to take in the message subliminally. However, it is difficult to prove that such advertising is happening, so companies that use it are hard to catch.
