Who?

Asking about a person.

Who is that woman? She's my teacher.

Who is she talking to? Olivia.

Who works in the garden? My father.



What?



Asking for a specific thing or object.

What is this? It's a book.

What time is it? It's 8 o'clock

What do they do after lessons?



When?

Asking about time, occasion, moment.

When is your birthday? It's in January.

When did you arrive? Yesterday.

When does she come? At 5 o'clock.

Where?

Asking at what place or position.

Where is my backpack? It's on the chair.

Where is the chair? It's in the classroom.

Where do you live? In the city centre.





Why?

Asking for a reason, explanation.

Why were you late?

Sorry, I missed my bus.

Why does she learn English? Because she wants to study in London.

How?

Asking for a way, manner, form.



How do you go to school?

I take the bus.


How many?

Asking about quantity. Used with countable nouns.

How many books have you got?

I've got three books.

How many children do they have? Four children.



How much?

Asking about quantity. Used with uncountable nouns.



How much homework have we got?

Don't worry. Not much.

How much time does she have for the exam? 2 hours



Which?

Asking about choice.

Which country would you prefer to live in?
Australia.

Which book do you like more? That one.
