GOLD HIDDEN INSIDE A PIANO

After a community group in Shropshire, England, decided to have a donated piano tuned, the tuner made an incredible discovery. Inside the piano, first sold in 1906, there was a hidden pile of gold. SHAKESPEARE'S ORIGINAL CLASSROOM REVEALED

Following a £1.8 million restoration, Shakespeare's Schoolroom & Guildhall in Stratford-upon-Avon opened its doors to the public on 23rd April, 2016. Located in the heart of the town and within a five-minute walk from Shakespeare's place of birth, this is the building where William Shakespeare is believed to 1. _____. Michael Wood, a historian and broadcaster, described it as "one of the most atmospheric, magical and important buildings in the whole of Britain." There are no surviving records of the school's pupils in the 16th century, but it is almost certain that this was the school Shakespeare attended until the age of 14 or 15. 2. _____ Shakespeare didn't go to university, all his formal education would have taken place in this single room. There would have been 40 boys, aged from 7 to 15, all taught together by the same teacher. This was a classical education which placed a strong 3. _____ on Latin and memorisation. In the building, visitors exploring Shakespeare's childhood learn the story of his time in Stratford – his education and the inspiration that 4. _____ him to become the world's greatest playwright.
