As the Internet has become more and more popular, we may be reading a great deal more than we used to. However, the way we are reading materials on the Internet, or online reading, is very different from the way we traditionally read printed materials.

In the traditional way of reading, we would start at the beginning of a book and read through to the end. In online reading, in contrast, we start reading a page, but may never see it through because a link on that page leads us to a passage on a different page, and so on. **As we go from one page to another, we have to remember various ideas at the same time.** This new way of reading is quite **distinct** from the traditional one.

There are both advantages and disadvantages of online reading. In online reading, the brain gets better than ever at doing many tasks at the same time, or multitasking, and thanks to this, we can work quickly and think creatively. Multitasking is useful in certain working environments, but **it** also makes it more difficult for us to read at a deep level. We are, therefore, much less likely to analyse what we read in a critical way, or gain any real **insight** into the contents we are reading. This might lead to a future when a whole new generation lacks the ability to think critically and deeply about what they are reading.

The world is changing and our brains are probably changing to meet new demands in the modern world, just as they have always done throughout history. However, it is important for us to consider how to maintain our critical, deeper reading skills, while still dealing with online reading materials.

Highly infectious viruses like SARS, Ebola, and SARS-CoV-2 have created worldwide crises since 2002, spreading fear across populations. Scientists have determined that **these** originated from wild animals inhabiting dense tropical forests, which are being destroyed for agriculture, mining, and housing. The more we clear, the more we **come into contact with** wildlife which hosts illnesses likely transferred to humans.

Stopping deforestation will not only reduce natural disasters but also control the spread of a long list of dangerous diseases that have come from rain forest habitats - Zika, Nipah, malaria, cholera, HIV, and so on. A 2019 study found that a 10 percent increase in deforestation would raise malaria cases by 3.3 percent; that would be 7.4 million people worldwide. Meanwhile, an average of 28 million hectares of forest have been cut down annually since 2016, and there is no sign of a slowdown. **[A]** Societies can take numerous steps to prevent the destruction. Eating less meat, which improves our health anyway, will lessen demand for crops and pastures. Eating fewer processed foods will reduce the demand for palm oil, much of which is grown on land from tropical rain forests. **Producing more food per hectare can boost supply without the need for more land.** **[B]**

In the meantime, governments should prohibit the sale of live wild animals in so-called wet markets, where pathogens have repeatedly crossed over into humans. The markets may be culturally important, but the risk is too great. Governments must also ban illegal wildlife trade, which can spread infectious agents far and wide. In addition, authorities must examine factory farms that pack thousands of animals together - the source of the 2009 swine flu outbreak that killed more than 10,000 people in the U.S. and many more people worldwide. **[C]**

Ending deforestation and preventing pandemics would address six of the United Nations' 17 Sustainable Development Goals: the guarantee of healthy lives, zero hunger, gender equality, responsible consumption and production, sustainably managed land, and climate action. The COVID-19 pandemic is a catastrophe, but it calls for our **attention** on the human achievements by not overexploiting the natural world. **[D]**
