Notes for Student A

Dolphins

- Social intelligence
- Complex communication (clicks, whistles, "names")
- Teamwork in pods
- Tool use (marine sponges)
- Cooperative hunting
- Altruism (helping injured members, rescuing others, even individuals from other species)

Crows

- Advanced problem-solving
- Tool use and tool creation
- Urban adaptability
- Strategic behavior (using traffic to crack nuts)
- Facial recognition (remembering humans)

Notes for Student B

Elephants

- Long-term memory (routes, water sources)
- Knowledge transmission across generations
- Emotional intelligence
- Empathy and mourning
- Self-awareness (mirror recognition)

Octopuses

- Problem-solving skills
- Escape behavior
- Maze navigation
- Observational learning
- Advanced camouflage (color and texture change)
- Creative solutions (e.g., short-circuiting lights)

African Gray Parrots

- Mimicry with understanding
- Concept learning (numbers, shapes, colors)
- Object identification
- Simple sentence formation
- Reasoning abilities



Chimpanzees

- Advanced tool use and manipulation
- Hunting cooperation
- Food sharing
- Empathy and fairness
- Sign language learning
- Human-like social behavior
