

Responsible Citizens Build Strong Nations

A responsible citizen is the **backbone** of a strong nation. Responsibility is not just about following rules; it is about having **civic awareness** and caring about the well-being of others. When people ignore their duties, society begins to weaken.

For example, spreading rumors online can create a **storm** of confusion. The word *storm* does not mean real rain here. Instead, it suggests chaos and strong negative reactions. In contrast, citizens who show **integrity** and participate in community projects help build trust.

During times of crisis, responsible citizens demonstrate **resilience**, a technical term that means the ability to recover from difficulties. Their positive actions create a ripple effect, encouraging others to act wisely and responsibly.
