

Reported Speech – Statements

We use reported speech to say what another person said.

- **Direct speech** = exact words
- **Reported speech** = we explain what the person said
 - **Direct Speech:** She said: "I am tired."
 - **Reported Speech:** She said (that) she was tired.

We usually change: Pronouns/Verb tense/Time expressions

Reported Speech

We use reported speech to tell someone what another person said.

Reported Speech: Statements

He is tired. → He said (that) **he was tired.**

TIP: You can use "that" or leave it out. It's optional!

Basic Tenses		
PS Present Simple	I like pizza. → am/is/are	→ She said (that) she liked pizza.
PS Past Simple	I liked the movie.	→ He said (that) he had liked the movie.
PC Past Continuous	I was studying. → was/were + verb (-ing)	→ She said (that) she had been studying.
PP Present Perfect	I have seen the show.	→ He said (that) he had seen the show.
F Future	I will call you. → will	→ She said (that) she would call me.
M Modal	I can/will/may swim. → could/might	→ He said (that) he could/would/might swim.

Other Changes

Direct	Reported
today	that day
now	then
tomorrow	the next day
yesterday	the day before
here	there
