

A Long Way to Travel

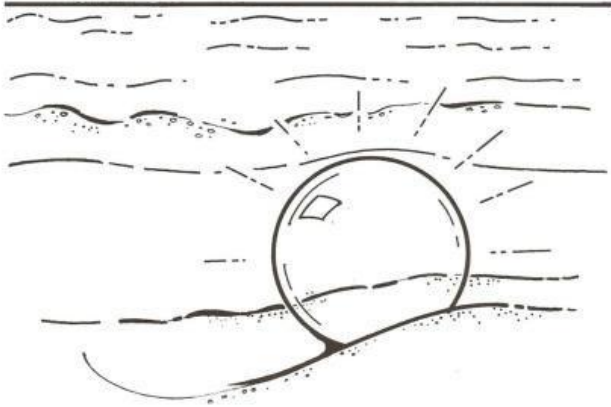
Alex and his mother were walking on the beach one day after a storm.
