Buried treasure

What do we do with things we don't use anymore? Some people throw things away. Other people put things at the back of the cupboard and forget about them. Over the next few months, Shivon found lots of valuable toys, paintings, clothes and many other things. She even found a handbag that used to belong to Jackie Kennedy. The things were sold for around 1.5 million euros.
