

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GRAMMAR CONCEPTS – INFORMATION**Suffixes –er and –est****What are suffixes –er and –est?**

We add **–er** to compare **two things**.

We add **–est** to compare **more than two things**.

Examples

- My house is **bigger** than yours.
- This bag is the **biggest** of all.
- Ali is **taller** than Sam.
- She is the **fastest** runner.

Conjunctions (Joining Words)**What is a conjunction?**

A conjunction joins words or sentences together.

Common conjunctions

- and
- but
- because
- so

Examples

- I like apples **and** bananas.
- I wanted to play, **but** it was raining.
- I stayed inside **because** it was hot.
- I was tired, **so** I went to bed.

Subordinating Conjunctions**What is a subordinating conjunction?**

It joins a sentence and gives **more information** about time or reason.

Common subordinating conjunctions

- because
- when
- if

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Examples

- I stayed home **because** I was sick.
- **When** the bell rang, we lined up.
- **If** it rains, we will stay inside.
- She smiled **while** she was reading.

Prepositions

What is a preposition?

A preposition tells us **where** something is.

Common prepositions

- in
- on
- under
- next to
- behind

Examples

- The cat is **under** the table.
- My bag is **on** the chair.
- The ball is **in** the box.
- The car is **next to** the tree.

Punctuation – Full Stop (.) Exclamation Mark (!) Question Mark (?)

What is a full stop?

A full stop is used at the end of a **statement**.

What is an exclamation mark?

An exclamation mark shows **strong feelings** like excitement or surprise.

What is a question mark?

A question mark is used at the end of a **question**.

What is a command?

A command tells someone to **do something**.

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Examples

I like reading.

Wow!

What is your name?

Sit down.

Noun Phrases

What is a noun phrase?

A noun phrase has a **describing word + noun**.

Examples

- a **big dog**
- the **red ball**
- my **new bag**
- three **small birds**

Homophones

What are homophones?

Homophones are words that **sound the same** but have **different meanings**.

Examples

- sun / son
- see / sea
- one / won
- here / hear

Example sentences

- I can **see** the **sea**.
- My **son** likes the **sun**.
