Women Can Succeed at Work

Women control 85% of all shopping, about \$20 trillion, and use money wisely. Skills from motherhood, like leadership and management, help women succeed at work. Government or men's help is not needed.

To get more women into senior jobs, women need confidence. Encourage women to study, get training, and show examples of successful women in management. Women can help each other through mentoring, advice, and guidance. Women in senior positions can use their influence to promote other women. Kitty Johnston says: ***"There is no limit to what we, as women, can accomplish."***

Traditional crops and composting (Composting are making old food and plants into healthy soil) can improve the soil. The United Nations World Food Programme supports this approach.
