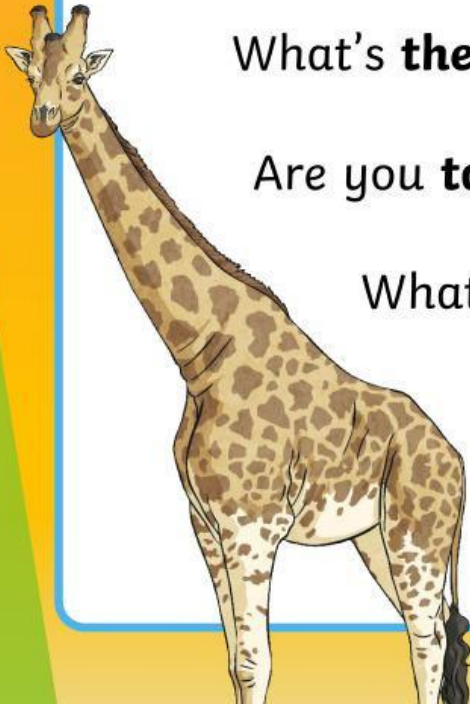

Comparatives

Comparatives are used to compare two things

For short adjectives we often add '-er' to the adjective:

tall → taller

For longer adjectives we add 'more' or 'less' before the adjective:

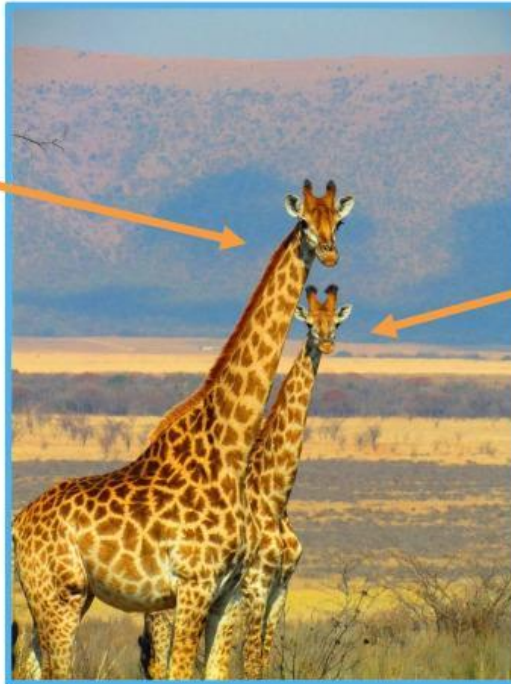
beautiful → more beautiful

popular → less popular

Comparatives

Superlatives

Superlatives are used to compare three or more things

For short adjectives we add '**-est**' to the adjective:

fast → fastest

For long adjectives we use '**most**' or '**least**' before the adjective:

interesting → most interesting

expensive → least expensive

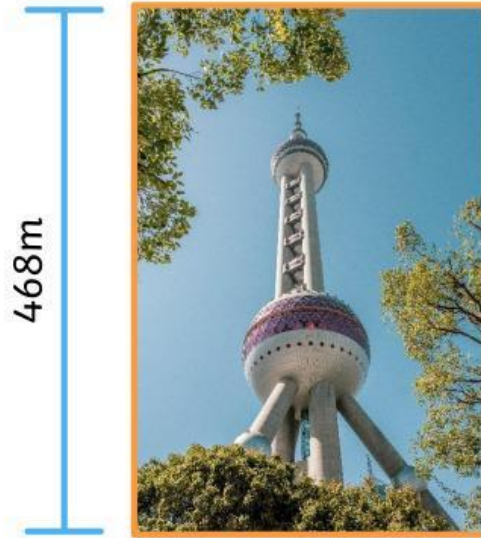

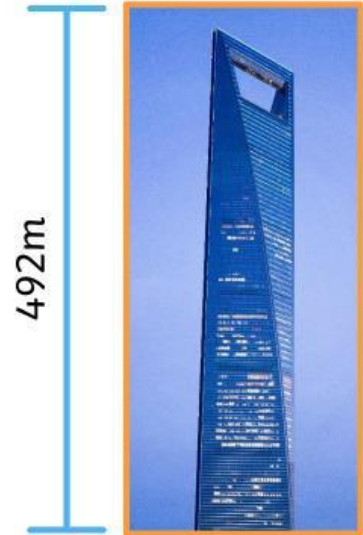

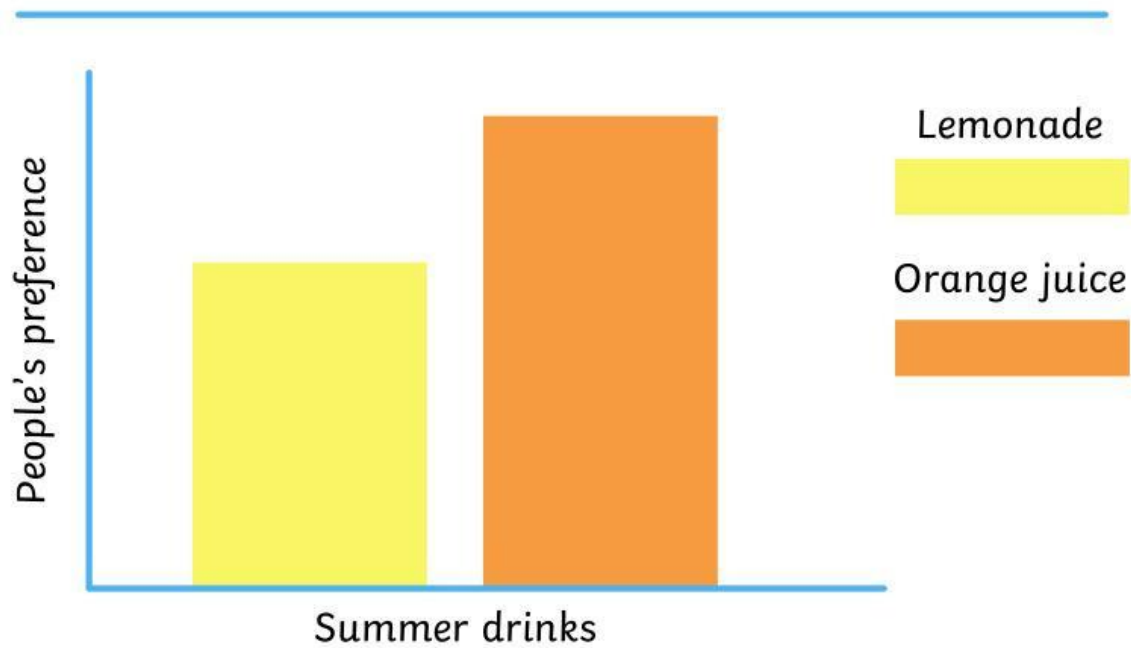
