Quick Review: Which Word?



Countable Nouns: Things you can count (1, 2, 3). Examples: *apples, books, students*.

Uncountable Nouns: Things you cannot count (liquids, powders, ideas). Examples: *water, rice, money*.

Countable Nouns (Use these)	Uncountable Nouns (Use these)
How many ?	How much ?
Many / A few	Much / A little

Picture Sentences


Look at the pictures below. Write a full sentence for each picture using the **quantifier** in brackets.
