Tenses: In grammar the word **Tenses** refers to the **Time** when something happens.

When things happen at different times we change the verb to indicate when something happened like the word “eat” being changed into the word “ate”.

There are **Four** basic kinds of **Tenses**:

The Simple Tense: Used for everyday occurrences

The Progressive Tense: Used for a process that takes a while

The Perfect Tense: Used when one thing happens before another

The Perfect Progressive Tense: Used when one process happens before another

Each Tense has three Variations **Past, Future and Present.**

The Past Progressive Tense:

Exam Question 1: When do we use the Simple Past?

Exam Answer 1: When two things were happening at the same time or, when something that happened in the past took a while to complete.

Example: While you were eating lunch, I was reading a book.

Exam Question 2: What happens to the verb in the Past Progressive Tense?

Exam Answer 2: The past tense form of the verb *to be* is placed in front of the verb and the present participle: “-ing” is added to the end of the verb.

Examples: “Eat” becomes “was/were eating”, Walk becomes “was/were Walking”, “Drink” becomes “was/were drinking”.

The Present Progressive Tense

Exam Question 3: When do we use the Present Progressive Tense?

Exam Answer 3: We use the Present Progressive Tense when something started in the past, is continuing now, and will finish sometime in the future.

Example: I am writing a down an example *right now*.

Example: You are reading this sentence *at this moment*.

Exam Question 4: What happens to the verb in the Present Progressive Tense?

Exam Answer 4:

Example: “Eat becomes: “Am/ Is/Are **Eating**”, “Walk” becomes “Am/ Is/Are **Walking**”, “drink” becomes “Am/ Is/Are **drinking**”

Time Words: Right now, at the moment, at present, Just now, for the time being.

The Future Progressive Tense:

Exam Question 4: When do we use the Future Progressive Tense?

Exam Answer 4: We use the Future Progressive Tense when a process will start in the future but will take a while to finish.

Exam Question 5: What happens to the verb in the Future Progressive Tense?

Exam Answer 5: In the Future Progressive Tense we add the word “Will” in front of the base form of the verb along with the verb “*be*”. The present participle “-ing.” gets added at the end of the verb as with all progressive tenses.

Example: “Walk” becomes “will be walking”, “eat” becomes “will be eating”, “drink” becomes “will be drinking”

Time Words: while, when, this time tomorrow, this time next week, in the afternoon, next month, next week, next year.
