Động từ khuyết thiếu (modal verbs) là những động từ được dùng để thể hiện khả năng, sự cho phép, nghĩa vụ, lời khuyên, khả năng xảy ra,...

✓ Một số động từ khuyết thiếu thường gặp:

Modal Verb Ý nghĩa (khi dùng thường)

- có thể
- có thể (quá khứ/giả định)
- có thể, cho phép
- có thể (khả năng thấp)
- phải (bắt buộc)
- nên (lời khuyên)
- sẽ
- sẽ (giả định)
- sẽ (trang trọng hơn "will")

● II. Câu bị động là gì?

Câu bị động là câu mà chủ ngữ là người hoặc vật nhận hành động, không phải là người thực hiện hành động.

✓ **Cấu trúc chung của câu bị động:**

Passive Voice:

(trong đó V3 là quá khứ phân từ của động từ chính)

● **III. Dạng bị động của động từ khuyết thiếu**

(Passive Voice with Modal Verbs)

Cấu trúc:

Giải thích: Khi muốn chuyển câu có động từ khuyết thiếu sang dạng bị động, ta thêm từ "be" sau modal verb và giữ nguyên dạng V3/ed của động từ chính.

✧ **Ví dụ:**

Câu chủ động (Active)	Câu bị động (Passive)
People must respect gender equality.	
We should teach boys to share chores.	
They can give her a scholarship.	
The teacher might punish the students.

2. Modal + be + being + V3/ed

(Diễn tả hành động đang diễn ra ở thì)

The house **must be being painted** now.

(Ngôi nhà chắc chắn đang được sơn.)

(Ít dùng hơn trong giao tiếp hàng ngày)
