1. The movies we watch, the advertisements we see, and the posts we scroll through on social media all tell us stories about the world. One of the most important stories they tell is about men and women. For a long time, media often used stereotypes to show how men and women should act. These images can profoundly influence how we think about ourselves and others. **However, many of these ideas are now being challenged as more people around the world fight for gender equality.**

2. In the past, media presented very specific and traditional roles. Men were frequently shown as the main characters: strong, confident leaders who were successful in their careers and rarely showed their emotions. Their stories were often about adventure or business. In contrast, women were typically shown in supporting roles, perhaps as caring mothers, helpful assistants, or characters who were mainly concerned with their appearance and finding love. These portrayals **conveyed** a clear message that men should be powerful providers and women should be gentle caregivers. This created a limited view of what people could be. [I]

3. These old stereotypes are problematic because they can limit people's potential. [II] When children see the same types of characters over and over, **they** might believe they can only be what they see on screen. For example, a boy who likes art might feel pressured to pursue sports instead, while a girl who is good at math might be discouraged from becoming an engineer. This can prevent them from following their true passions. Thankfully, the call for gender equality - the belief that all genders deserve equal rights and opportunities - is changing this. [III]

4. Today, the media is beginning to paint a new picture. More movies and TV shows are featuring female characters who are brave heroes, brilliant scientists, and powerful leaders. [IV] At the same time, male characters are being shown with more emotional depth, as caring fathers, and as partners who share household responsibilities equally. Social media has also become a powerful tool for change, where many creators and communities share messages that break down old stereotypes and celebrate all identities. This new direction in media helps everyone feel that they can be anything they want to be.
