Affirmative	Subject + am/is/are + going to + base verb	She is going to be a teacher.
Negative	Subject + am/is/are + not + going to + base verb	He is not going to become a doctor.
Yes/No Question	Am/Is/Are + subject + going to + base verb?	Are they going to work as engineers?
Wh- Question	Wh-word + am/is/are + subject + going to + base verb?	What are you going to do in the future?
