1. In many countries, the idea of having school days without homework is becoming more popular. For a long time, homework has been an important part of education because it helps students review lessons and practice new skills. However, some schools are now trying a “homework-free” policy. They believe that the time students spend on homework could be used for other useful activities, such as playing, resting, or spending time with family, which are also important for a child’s growth.

2. Supporters of this policy say it has several advantages. First, it can reduce stress, as many students feel tired after a full day at school. With more free time, children can enjoy their hobbies and feel more relaxed, which may improve their creativity and mental health. A homework-free system can also improve family life. When students do not have unfinished assignments, families can spend more enjoyable time together, leading to stronger relationships.

Without it, students might forget new information more quickly. **Additionally, some parents worry that without homework, their children might not develop essential skills like time management and independent study.** They believe these skills are important for future education, especially in high school and university.

Although it may reduce stress and improve family time, it also raises questions about learning and skills development. The success of a homework-free policy may depend on students’ ages, the support they receive at school, and the goals of the education system. Finding the right balance between schoolwork and free time remains an important challenge for teachers and parents.

A Shift in Household Responsibilities

1. A new study has shown that modern families are changing the way they share housework. For many years, traditional gender roles were **prevalent**. Women usually took care of the children and did most household chores, while men were often the main earners in the family. However, the study, which surveyed more than 5,000 adults, shows that these old norms are slowly disappearing. Many families are now moving toward a more equal way of sharing daily tasks.
2. The report says the change is strongest among younger people. Many adults under 40 want to share responsibilities such as cooking, cleaning, and looking after children. **This suggests that younger people are choosing not to follow the strict roles that were common in their parents' or grandparents' time.** The study also explains that fathers are becoming more involved in their children's lives. For example, **they** help with homework and go to school events. [I] These actions are part of a bigger cultural change toward more equality between men and women.
3. There are several reasons for this shift. First, more households have two working parents, so sharing chores is necessary for a balanced home life. [II] Second, people's attitudes are changing. Schools, social media, and TV now promote the idea that men and women should work together as equal partners. [III] Because of this, many couples see housework as teamwork, not something decided by gender.
4. Looking to the future, the study predicts that this trend is expected to continue. As more young people form their own families, the model of shared household duties will likely become the new standard. [IV] While this transition is not without its challenges, the overall direction points toward a future where partnership and practicality decide who does what at home, instead of traditional gender roles. This shift has broad implications, potentially affecting everything from workplace policies to family laws.
