

## **Outer Banks Filming Locations in Charleston**

Charleston, South Carolina — paradise on earth. Does that sound familiar? On this episode of *Lively Charleston*, follow along as I share the top 10 film locations you can visit from Netflix's teen drama *Outer Banks*. On April 15, 2020, Netflix released a new TV show called *Outer Banks*. It quickly stole the hearts of viewers young and old and made quarantine days a little brighter. Although the show is set in the Outer Banks of North Carolina, it was actually filmed right here in the Lowcountry of South Carolina.

### **1. Kildare County Sheriff's Station**

Number one on our list is the Kildare County Sheriff's Station. In reality, this is a condominium building located at 218 Venning Street in the Old Village of Mount Pleasant. A visit to this charming neighborhood is a must. While you're there, stop by the Pitt Street Pharmacy soda fountain just across the street for a milkshake and a grilled cheese sandwich.

### **2. St. Paul's Lutheran Church**

Also located in the Old Village of Mount Pleasant is St. Paul's Lutheran Church. Right before Sheriff Peterkin is killed, she meets with Lana, Scooter's widow, at this quaint church located at 604 Pitt Street. You can easily walk here after visiting the sheriff's station — and burn off that milkshake and grilled cheese.

### **3. The Ocean Course at Kiawah Island Golf Resort**

The Ocean Course at Kiawah Island Golf Resort serves as the venue for the Kooks-only Midsummer Night's Gala. A visit to this world-class golf course is truly a first-class experience.

### **4. Lowndes Grove Plantation**

Lowndes Grove Plantation, referred to as Tanneyhill Plantation in the show, is the home of Sarah Cameron and her family. In real life, this historic estate is a wedding and events venue. Built in 1786, it is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

### **5. Shem Creek**

If you've seen any scene involving the Pogues on a boat, chances are you've caught a glimpse of the waterside boardwalk at Shem Creek in Mount Pleasant. It's a perfect spot to soak up the sun while watching shrimp boats come and go from the harbor. While you're there, you can also grab a bite at Kiara's family restaurant, The Wreck — which, conveniently, is also called The Wreck in real life.

### **6. King Street (Downtown Charleston)**

Need a makeover? There's no better place to transform from Pogue to Kook than the shops on King Street in downtown Charleston. Ben Silver, located at 149 King Street, is where Sarah Cameron takes John B for his much-needed makeover before they infiltrate the UNC Chapel Hill law library.

### **7. Charleston Gaillard Center**

The stunning Gaillard Center played the role of the UNC Chapel Hill law library. This is where Sarah and John B go during their mission. In real life, the Gaillard Center regularly hosts notable artists, performers, and scholars.

### **8. Morris Island Lighthouse**

Lighthouses are a staple in any coastal town, and Charleston has several. The Morris Island Lighthouse makes multiple appearances in *Outer Banks*, where it is portrayed as the Redfield Lighthouse. It appears in the very first episode — which is when many Charleston locals realized the show was filmed right in their backyard.

### 9. Palmetto Islands County Park

The Hawk's Nest Tower, where John B falls in the fifth episode, is actually the observation tower at Palmetto Islands County Park. This public park allows visitors to explore the area and even climb the Hawk's Nest Tower themselves. And the view from the top is impressive.

### 10. Old Bethel AME Church

One of the most swoon-worthy scenes in the series is when John B takes Sarah to his "secret place." That location is Old Bethel AME Church in McClellanville, about 45 minutes from Charleston. This abandoned Civil War-era church, which no longer has a physical address, is a must-see for devoted *Outer Banks* fans.
