<p>Industrialisation</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - excessive use of gas and electricity by (38) - emission of industrial gases <p>Effect: causes more gases to be trapped in the atmosphere</p>	<p><i>Sri Lankan factory model:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - uses renewable energy like (39) - recycles (40) for cleaning needs - planted trees to improve air and water quality
