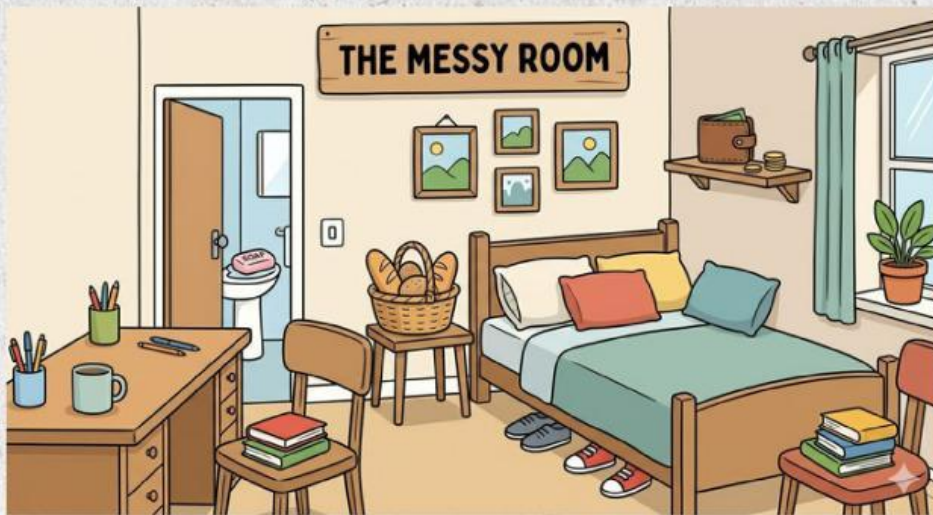




"The Messy Room" (Sentence Transformation)

There is some soap in the bathroom.

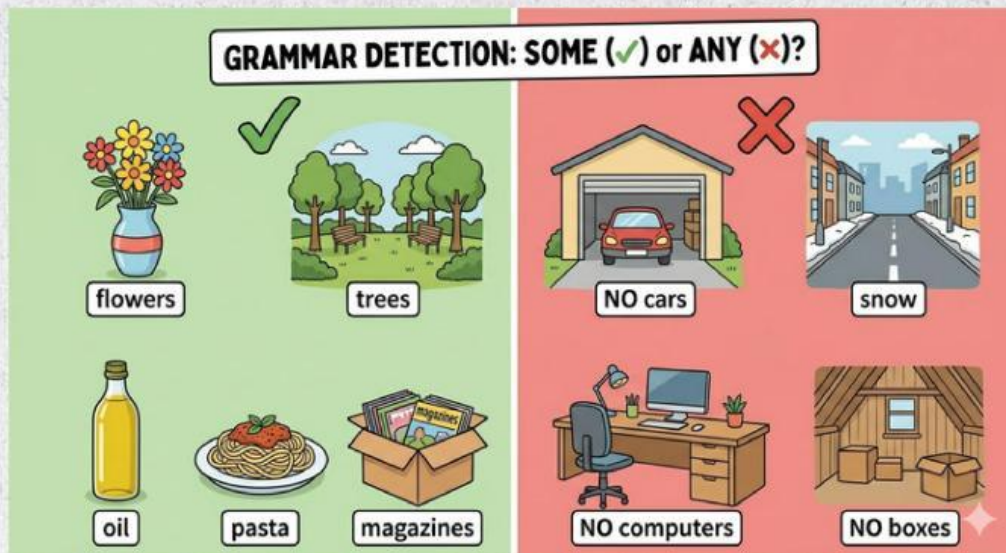
There are some shoes under the bed.
