Grammar Rule: Present-Tense Action Verbs

LO Content

A **present-tense action verb** tells what happens now or what happens often. If the subject of the sentence tells about one other person or thing, add **-s** to the end of most action verbs. For other subjects, do not add **-s**.

Examples: Tony **buys** eggs.

His sisters **buy** milk.
