David is doing the washing up and on Friday he's doing the shopping. Matt's cleaning the bathroom and cooking Monday _____. And I'm cleaning the living room and cooking on Thursday and Friday. Has everybody got that?

Jane: Yes.

David: Yep.

Helen: Good.

[Scene changes to Jane returning from town.]

Jane: Hi!

Helen: Hi!

Jane: What are you doing?

Helen: What does it _____ I'm doing?

Jane: Why have you got that shopping?

Helen: Er, let's see, because it's my day for shopping.

Jane: But I did the shopping today. ... You're cooking tonight.

Helen: No, it's Friday. You're cooking tonight.

Jane: But that was last Friday. You did the shopping and I cooked, _____?

Helen: Let's go in and look at the rota.

[Scene changes to the boys in the living room.]

David: It's my day for the living room.

Matt: No, it isn't. You're in the bathroom today.

David: I cleaned the bathroom yesterday.

Matt: No, you didn't. You were watching television when I came home.

David: I did it after you went to bed.

Matt: _____.

David: No, you let go of it.

Jane: What's going on?

David: I came in to do the living room and he was cleaning the carpet.

Matt: It's my turn.

David: No, it isn't.

Matt: Yes, it is.

Helen: Boys.

Matt: Why are you both _____ shopping?

Helen: Jane got the wrong day.

Jane: I didn't get the wrong day. You did.

David: And you did.
