Too and enough are used with **adjectives**, **adverbs** and **nouns**.

Too มากเกินไป
Enough พอ

Examples:

1. Too + adjective:

He is **too** short to play basketball.

2. Too + adverb:

You are driving **too** fast.

3. Adjective + enough:

They aren't rich **enough** to buy a big house.
She's old **enough** to get married.

4. Adverb + enough:

Hurry up, we aren't walking quickly **enough**.

5. Enough + noun:

We have got **enough** eggs to make a cake.
You've got **enough** time to revise your lessons.

6. Too much + uncountable nouns (นามนับไม่ได้):

I can't sleep at night because they make **too much** noise.

7. Too many + countable nouns (นามนับได้):

Too many people came to the party yesterday.
We didn't have enough plates.
