

Possessive Adjectives: They are placed before a noun to describe who something belongs to. They do not replace the noun. **Remember: They are always followed by a noun.**

I →	my	This is my book
You →	your	Is this your pen?
He →	his	That is his car.
She →	her	I like her dress.
It →	its	The dog wagged its tail.
We →	our	This is our house.
They →	their	That is their school.

Possessive Pronouns: They replace the noun completely, so we do not use a noun after them (e.g. this book is **mine**, **not mine book**). They help avoid repetition and make sentences shorter. **Remember: No noun after the pronoun.**

I →	mine	The book is mine .
You →	yours	This pen is yours .
He →	his	The car is his .
She →	hers	The dress is hers .
We →	ours	The house is ours .
They →	theirs	The school is theirs .

Reflexive Pronouns: Reflexive pronouns are used when the subject and the object of the sentence are the same person or thing. They show that someone does an action to themselves (e.g. She hurt herself)

I →	myself	I hurt myself .
You →	yourself/yourselfs	Take care of yourself .
He →	himself	He fixed the bike himself .
She →	herself	She made the dress herself .
It →	itself	The cat cleaned itself .
We →	ourselves	We prepared the project ourselves .
They →	themselves	They built the house themselves .
