## 1. Types of shops & stores (Типы магазинов)

- Grocery store / Supermarket – продуктовый магазин / супермаркет
- Hypermarket – гипермаркет (товары на все случаи жизни: Ашан, Леруа Мерлен)
- Convenience store – магазин у дома (работает 24/7)
- Department store – универсам (одежда, косметика, игрушки в одном здании)
- Shopping mall / Shopping centre – торговый центр
- Boutique – бутик (магазин дорогой одежды)
- Outlet – дисконтный центр (магазины с большими скидками)
- Pharmacy (Chemist's – брит.) – аптека
- Butcher's – мясная лавка
- Baker's – булочная-кондитерская
- Greengrocer's – овощной магазин
- DIY store (Do It Yourself) – строительный гипермаркет
- Bookstore / Newsagent's – книжный / киоск с прессой
- Electronics store – магазин электроники
- Flea market – блошинный рынок
- Charity shop – секонд-хенд (в пользу благотворительности, популярен в UK)
- Fishmonger's – рыбный магазин
- Dairy store – магазин молочных продуктов
- Confectionery / Sweet shop – кондитерская / магазин сладостей
- Liquor store (Off-licence – брит.) – магазин алкогольных напитков
- Stationery store – канцелярский магазин
- Pet shop – зоомагазин
- Furniture store – магазин мебели
- Sporting goods store – магазин спортивных товаров
- Jewellery store (Jewelry store – амер.) – ювелирный магазин
- Shoe shop – обувной магазин
- Clothing store – магазин одежды
- Second-hand shop – секонд-хенд (комиссионный магазин)
- Antique shop – антикварный магазин
- Discount store – магазин низких цен (например, Fix Price)
- Deli (Delicatessen) – гастроном (готовые салаты, мясные нарезки, сыры)
- Market stall – рыночная палатка / лоток
- Cash & carry – оптовый склад-магазин (например, Metro)

## 2. Locations & zones (Зоны и локации)

- Food court – зона фуд-корта (кафе и рестораны в ТЦ)
- Aisle – проход между стеллажами (в супермаркете)
- Shelf (pl. shelves) – полка
- Checkout / Till – касса
- Counter – прилавок (мясной, сырный отдел)
- Dressing room / Fitting room – примерочная
- Customer service desk – стойка информации и возврата товаров
- Locker – ячейка для хранения вещей
- Shopping cart (Trolley – брит.) – тележка
- Basket – корзина
- Parking lot – парковка



## 3. People & staff (Люди и персонал)

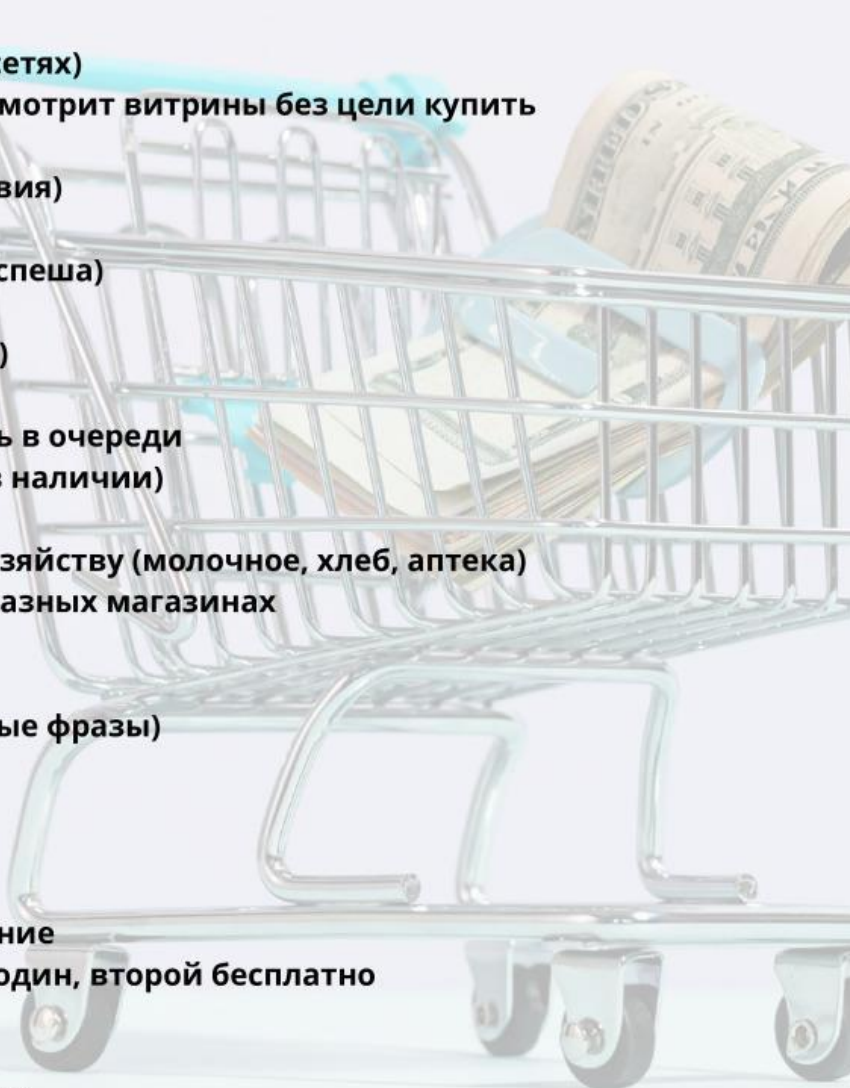
- Customer / Shopper – покупатель
- Shop assistant – продавец-консультант
- Cashier – кассир
- Security guard – охранник
- Bagger – упаковщик (есть в крупных сетях)
- Window shopper – человек, который смотрит витрины без цели купить

- To pick up – взять с полки
- To fit – подходить (о размере одежды)
- To cost – стоить
- To queue up (to line up – амер.) – стоять в очереди
- To be out of stock – закончиться (нет в наличии)
- To be in stock – быть в наличии
- To run errands – делать покупки по хозяйству (молочное, хлеб, аптека)
- To shop around – сравнивать цены в разных магазинах
- To haggle (to bargain) – торговаться
