Major political or social changes that profoundly transform a society.

Period during the 18th century in which philosophers introduced new ideas about knowledge social structures, and power.

A theory or set of ideas arrived at through reflection and reasoning.

A system of organizing powers in a society.

Political principles that requires the powers of government to be held by seperate bodies, or branches.

An individual who has rights within a society and can participate in government.

A wealthy person , often a merchant, artisan, or professional.

Refusal to buy or use the products of a company or state, to protest its actions.
