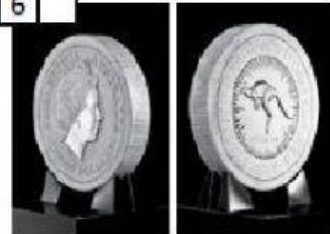
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AMAZING MONEY

Not all coins and notes are simple, dull and functional. From time to time, most countries have produced amazing money to celebrate important events or to deal with unusual financial problems. Here are just a few examples.



A America's biggest banknotes

Nowadays, a \$100 bill is the biggest banknote, in terms of value, in the United States. However, until the 1960s, it was possible to get hold of \$5,000 and \$10,000 bills. Even then, very few people actually ¹ _____ one, and the notes were mostly ² _____ by banks. In 1934, during the Great Depression, a period in history when the American economy was very weak, the government ³ _____ a \$100,000 banknote. It ⁴ _____ a picture of President Woodrow Wilson on the front. However, ordinary people weren't ⁵ _____ to use the notes. They were used by banks to make payments.

B The world's largest gold coin

A 'mint' is a place where money is ⁶ _____ and the Perth Mint is one of Australia's oldest centres for producing notes and coins. It ⁷ _____ in 1899, after the discovery of large amounts of gold in the area. In 2011, to ⁸ _____ 112 years of history, the Perth Mint produced one of the world's most amazing gold coins. It is 79 centimetres wide, 12 centimetres thick, and weighs one tonne. Not surprisingly, it is bigger than any other gold coin in the world. On one side of the coin is Queen Elizabeth II, who is Queen of Australia as well as Queen of the United Kingdom, and on the other side is a picture of a large red kangaroo. It ⁹ _____ eighteen months to ¹⁰ _____ the coin and, although it says it is worth one million Australian dollars on the front of the coin, it is actually worth more than fifty million dollars.

C The hundred trillion dollar banknote

In 2008, the African country of Zimbabwe had the highest inflation rate in the world. Prices were ¹¹ _____ at a rapid rate, and a loaf of bread ¹² _____ approximately 300 billion Zimbabwean dollars! In an attempt to provide banknotes that people could use to ¹³ _____ everyday things, the bank of Zimbabwe produced a note that was worth one hundred trillion (100,000,000,000,000) dollars! Doctors, nurses and teachers ¹⁴ _____ on strike, demanding that they should be ¹⁵ _____ in a foreign currency, and the government eventually agreed. Today, Zimbabwe doesn't have its own currency. It uses foreign currencies such as the euro and the American dollar. You can buy a one hundred trillion dollar note online. It will cost you about a euro!
