Subject Pronouns	Object Pronouns	- We use subject pronouns when the noun is the subject of the verb (the person who does the action). E.g. She plays football. - We use object pronouns when the noun is the object of the verb (the person who receives the action). Object pronouns go after the verb and after prepositions. E.g. Can you help me?

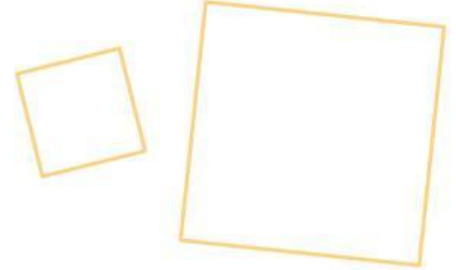
