🌟 Present Simple vs Past Simple

◊ Present Simple

- We use it for habits, routines, and facts
- Structure: Subject + verb (base form)
- Example: *She plays football every Saturday.*

👉 Tip for kids: If it's something you do again and again, use Present Simple.

◊ Past Simple

- We use it for finished actions in the past.
- Structure: Subject + verb (past form)
- Example: *She played football yesterday.*

👍 Tip for kids: If it happened yesterday, last week, or before, use Past Simple.
